Village Green



Those of you who have lived in the village for a little while

will be well aware that encroachment onto the village green is not a new problem. Besom Cottage is a converted barn and the site belongs to a local landowner. The area around the house, however, is part of the registered village green—the map (left) shows the extent of the green, comprising both the grassed area which was originally registered, and the woodland area later registered (red bordered on plan).

The Parish Council has, in the past, asked the owners of the land to respect the boundaries of the green,

but unfortunately, there has recently been further encroachment. The yard area to the side and rear of the cottage has been developed and a small portion of the green has been built on.
