# Elections 2021

Unless the Government changes its mind, elections will be held on 6 May this year, and local electors will choose 7 members of the community to represent them.

Would you like to join the Parish Council?

To be eligible to stand, you just have to live or work in or within 3 miles of the parish.

The Council increases in size this year, adding 2 seats to the existing 5. Even if the current councillors all wish to serve another term, and the community wants to support them do this, the Council has room for 2 more people to come forward. If more than 2 are interested, and more than 7 people are nominated to stand as councillors, an election will be organised by Craven District Council. If fewer than 7 people are nominated, the ones who have put their names forward will automatically be appointed without an election, and the new council will then meet later in May to co-opt additional members to fill any remaining vacancies.

The nomination process is simple to complete, even easier during an ongoing period of social restrictions, as the nomination can be proposed and seconded/witnessed by members of the same household. Forms are available in paper form or electronically from the Clerk, and need to be returned to her before 8 April. The Clerk will make an appointment to hand-deliver all nomination forms together to the District Council.

If you would like to find out more about the role of a councillor, the current members of the Council will be happy to explain what they do on the phone or by email—a full list of contact details is published on the back page—and, if there is sufficient interest, a remote public meeting will be specifically arranged in March for a question and answer session with the Council.

## Local Government Reorganisation

The Government is consulting the public on two competing proposals for the organisation of local governance in Craven and in North Yorkshire.

Whichever of the 2 structures is adopted, a new unitary authority will be established to take over the running of all local services, including highways, education and social care which are currently run by the County Council, and local planning, refuse collection and local taxation, currently in the hands of the District Council.

Our services should still be provided, largely as now, from the Highways Area office and the Belle Vue Skipton offices. Please do feed your views into the consultation.
